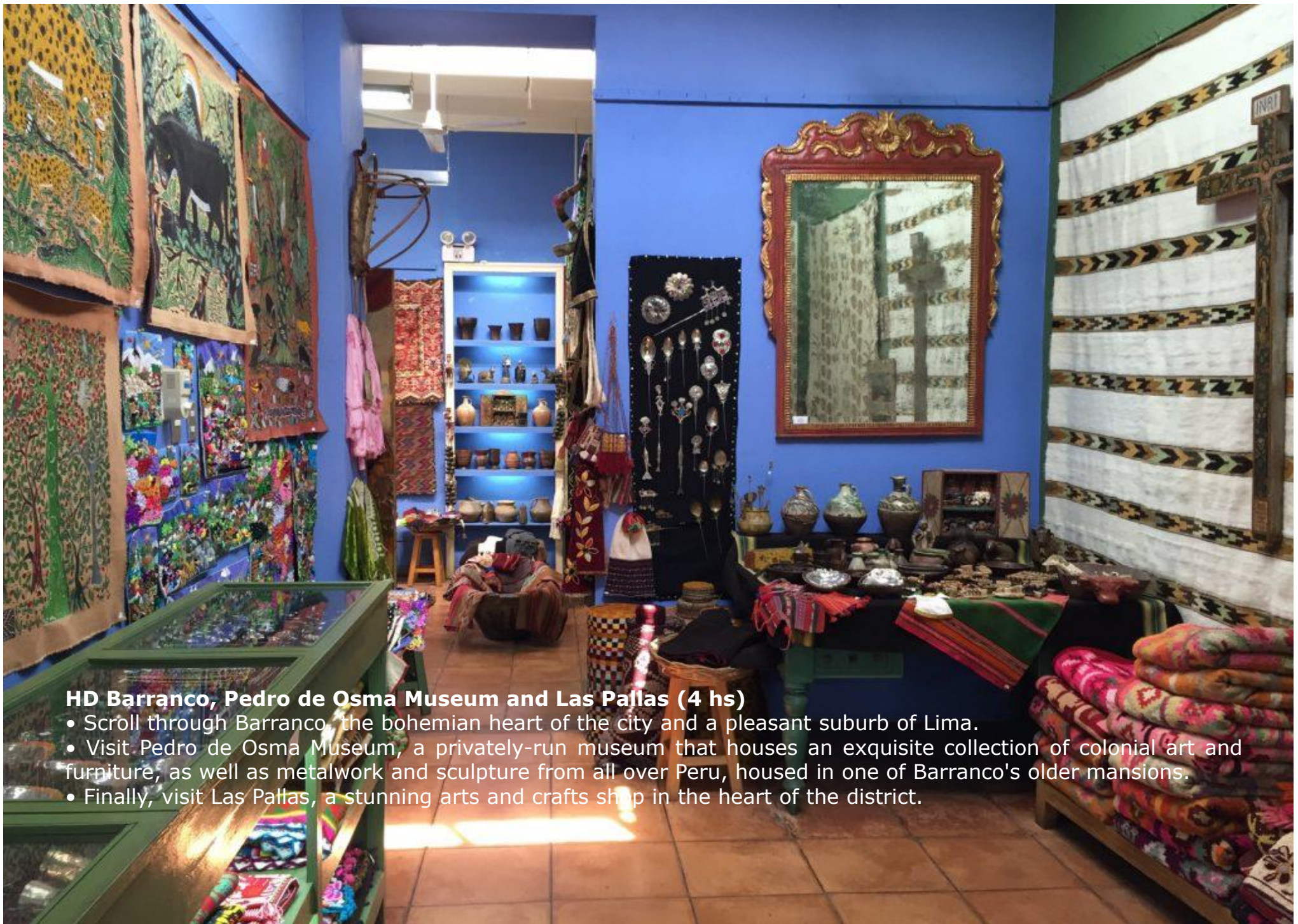

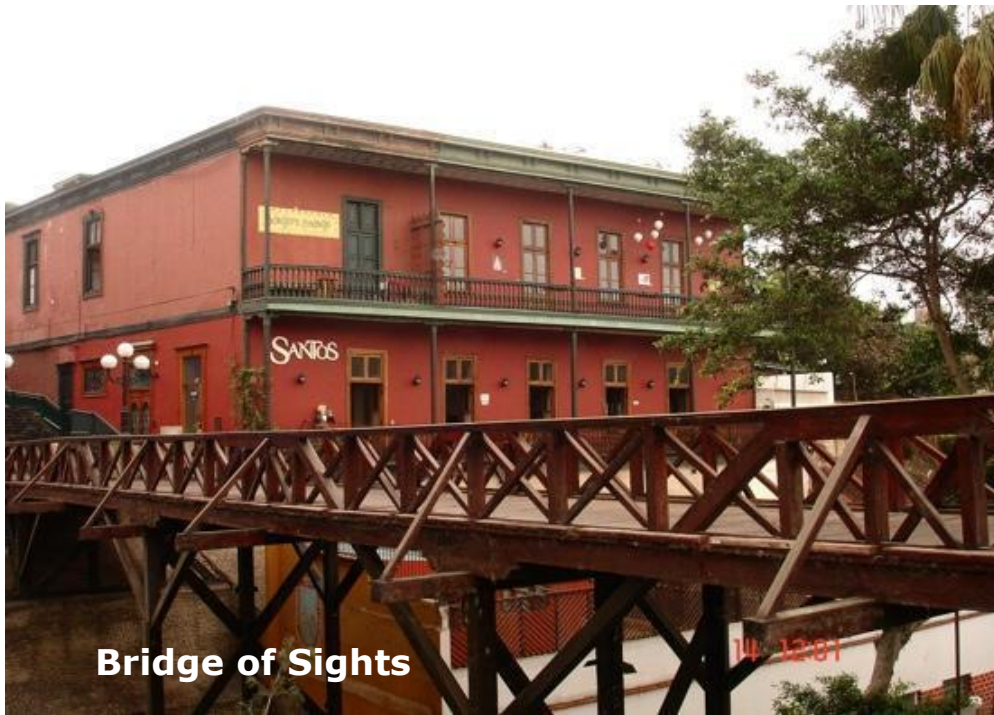

### **HD Barranco, Pedro de Osma Museum and Las Pallas (4 hs)**

- Scroll through Barranco, the bohemian heart of the city and a pleasant suburb of Lima.
- Visit Pedro de Osma Museum, a privately-run museum that houses an exquisite collection of colonial art and furniture, as well as metalwork and sculpture from all over Peru, housed in one of Barranco's older mansions.
- Finally, visit Las Pallas, a stunning arts and crafts shop in the heart of the district.

### HD Real Felipe's Fortress & La Punta Port (3 hs)

- Explore "La Punta", Callao's traditional district, ideal for walking and taking in the tangy sea breeze. This old quarter, once the home of Lima's aristocracy, features a superb ocean side promenade, pebble beaches and stately homes.
- Then, transport back to the exciting time when pirates crossed the oceans in the search of treasures by visiting the Real Felipe fortress, the biggest army construction made by the Spaniards during the XVIII century.



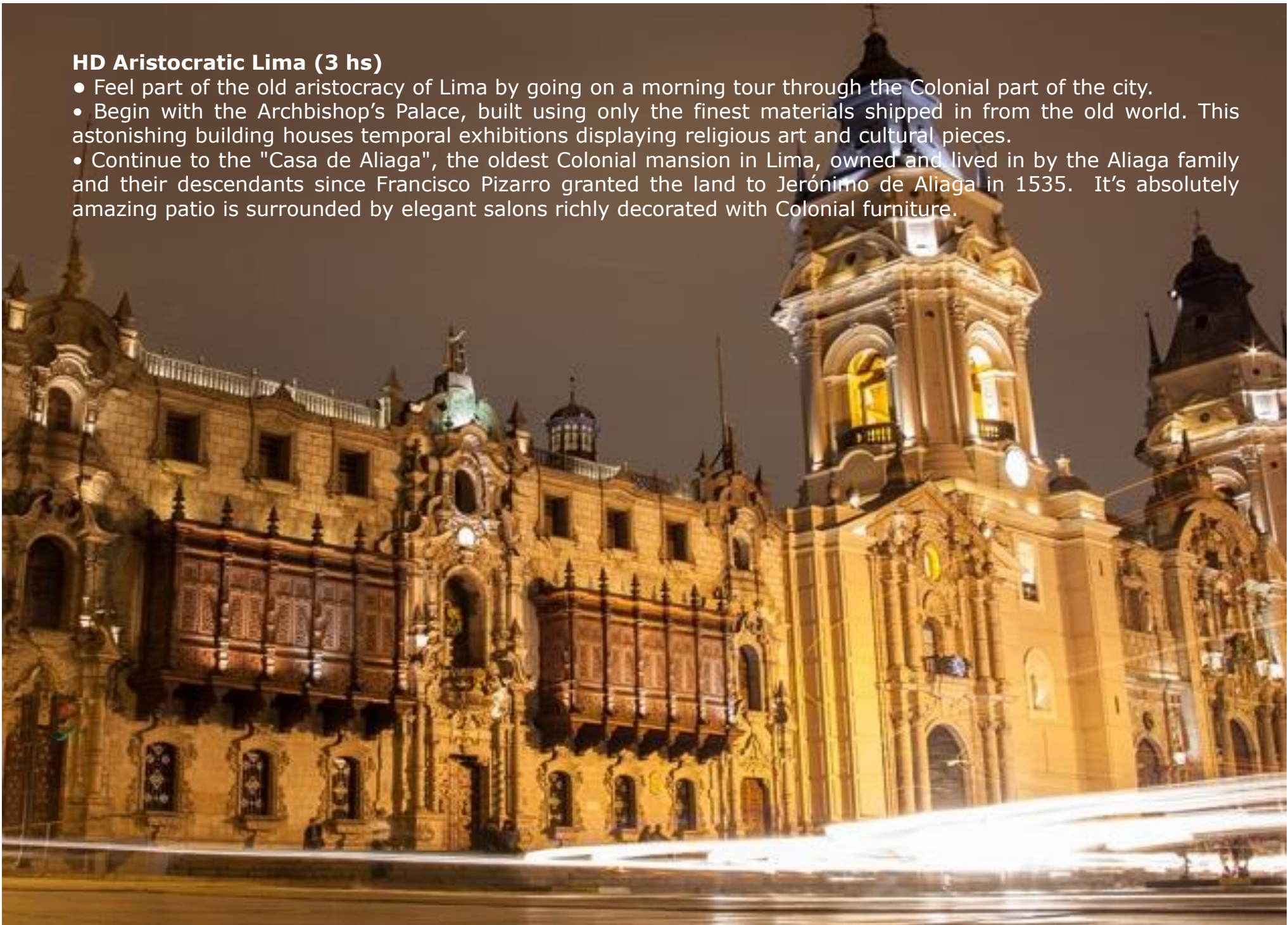

### HD Aristocratic Lima (3 hs)

- Feel part of the old aristocracy of Lima by going on a morning tour through the Colonial part of the city.
- Begin with the Archbishop's Palace, built using only the finest materials shipped in from the old world. This astonishing building houses temporal exhibitions displaying religious art and cultural pieces.
- Continue to the "Casa de Aliaga", the oldest Colonial mansion in Lima, owned and lived in by the Aliaga family and their descendants since Francisco Pizarro granted the land to Jerónimo de Aliaga in 1535. It's absolutely amazing patio is surrounded by elegant salons richly decorated with Colonial furniture.

### **INTO THE HEART OF LIMA'S TRADITIONS (4 hrs)**

- This special City Tour will take you through 500 years of history, to discover the traditions hidden in every corner of the capital of Peru.
- Visit a local market, an old-world dining hall and the traditional bar at El Bolivar Hotel, declared Historical monument on 1972 where the best Pisco Sour is served.
- Then, visit the modern part of Lima, passing through Huaca Huallamarca in San Isidro and finally, delight yourself with a pleasant walk with a nice ocean view.

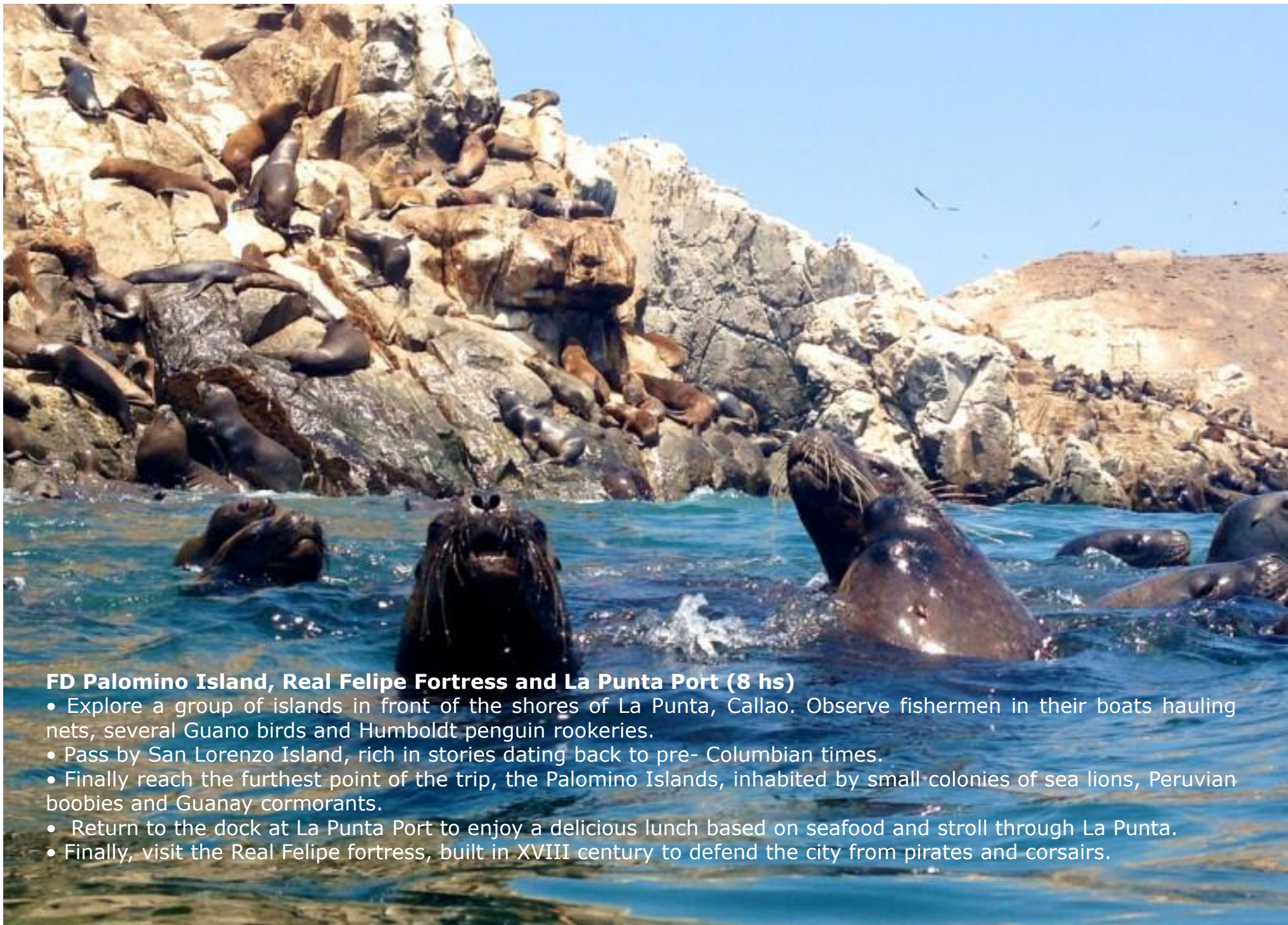

### **FD Palomino Island, Real Felipe Fortress and La Punta Port (8 hs)**

- Explore a group of islands in front of the shores of La Punta, Callao. Observe fishermen in their boats hauling nets, several Guano birds and Humboldt penguin rookeries.
- Pass by San Lorenzo Island, rich in stories dating back to pre- Columbian times.
- Finally reach the furthest point of the trip, the Palomino Islands, inhabited by small colonies of sea lions, Peruvian boobies and Guanay cormorants.
- Return to the dock at La Punta Port to enjoy a delicious lunch based on seafood and stroll through La Punta.
- Finally, visit the Real Felipe fortress, built in XVIII century to defend the city from pirates and corsairs.

### **Lima, a city of contrasts (3.5 hs)**

- Visit the picturesque dock of Chorrillos where fishermen, street vendors and some sea birds interact vividly.
- Then, go up the Morro Solar to enjoy the best view of the coast. Continue to "La Herradura", one of the most popular beaches in Lima back in the day.
- Later, walk around Barranco's famous "bridge of sighs" and finish with a walk along the "Bajada de Baños" a flower filled path to the beach

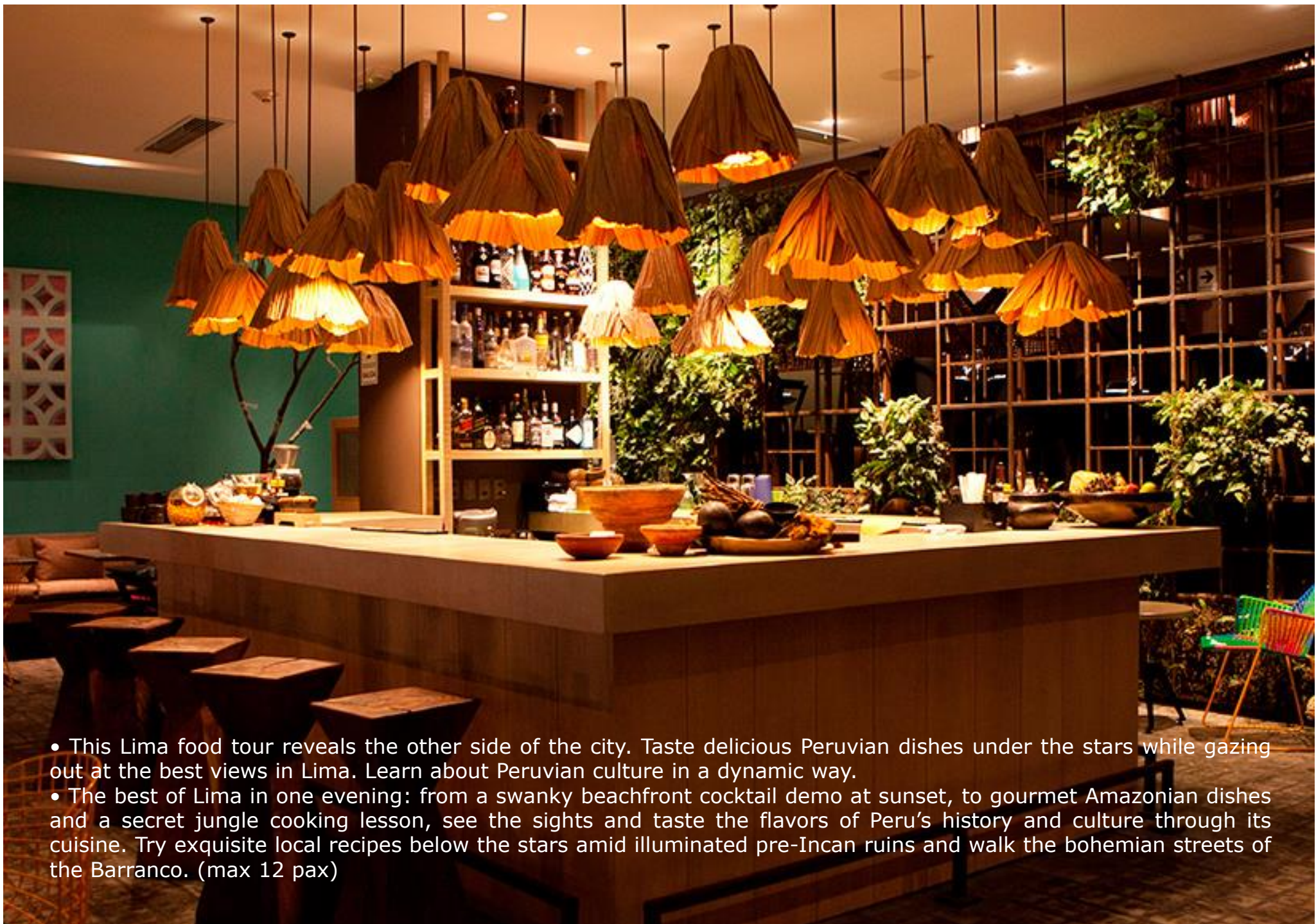

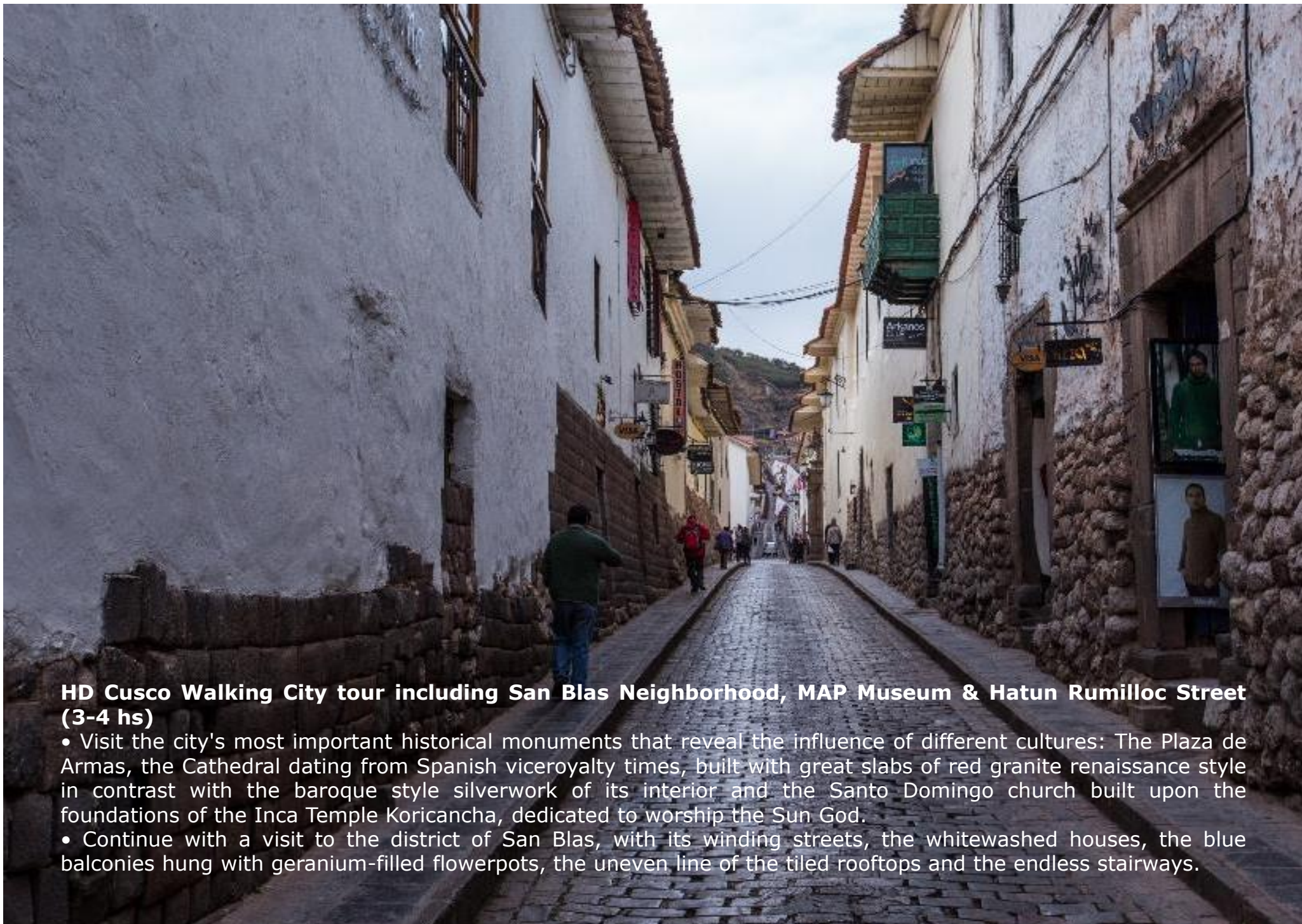

### **HD Cusco Walking City tour including San Blas Neighborhood, MAP Museum & Hatun Rumilloc Street (3-4 hs)**

- Visit the city's most important historical monuments that reveal the influence of different cultures: The Plaza de Armas, the Cathedral dating from Spanish viceroyalty times, built with great slabs of red granite renaissance style in contrast with the baroque style silverwork of its interior and the Santo Domingo church built upon the foundations of the Inca Temple Koricancha, dedicated to worship the Sun God.
- Continue with a visit to the district of San Blas, with its winding streets, the whitewashed houses, the blue balconies hung with geranium-filled flowerpots, the uneven line of the tiled rooftops and the endless stairways.
